How MYOB is preparing more students for a career in business

The role of technology is pivotal in both business and education. Increasingly, educators need software solutions that not only facilitate learning, but also provide students with the experiential training they'll need to compete on the job market.

That's why MYOB has been working hard to partner with educators like Nikki Schonfeldt, a lecturer of accounting for the University of Western Australia's Business School.

As unit coordinator for the introductory financial accounting units offered as part of UWA's Master of Professional Accounting course, Schonfeldt has a clear view of the breadth of skills her students must develop.

"Recent developments in international accounting education standards and accreditation requirements have reinforced the importance of developing ICT skills in accounting graduates to ensure they are ready for the demands of the accounting profession today," she said.

Schonfeldt then began to consider how to integrate this thinking into her course plans. "In response to these changes, I developed an integrated assignment which enables students to not only consolidate their understanding of the accounting cycle, but also develop skills in using spreadsheets as well as accounting software."

For the rest, MYOB stepped in to offer the right tools for the task. "MYOB offers all the functionality required to execute the assignment at no extra cost to the student or the university," said Schonfeldt.

"The support resources available are comprehensive and intuitive, which means students can complete the assignment with self-directed learning, meaning we don't have to sacrifice class time to teach the use of the software.

"This is important for two reasons: first, the accounting curriculum is content heavy, which means there is little scope to add an additional topic let alone teaching different software."

"Second, with the large volume of support readily available on the internet, students must learn how to resolve technical problems utilising online support."

"Finally, given the pace of technological change, I want my students to have the ability to adapt to change."

One of the key reasons behind the need for student access to modern accounting and business management software lies in their power to derive actionable insight. The ability to access live reporting and the ability to develop useful insights is exactly one of the points Schonfeldt is seeking to promote in her courses.

"Accounting software has seen significant advances in recent years and is now an essential business advisory tool that can be used to run a more efficient business," she said.

"With the increased reliance on accounting software, employers expect graduates to have the ability to adapt to new technologies. It is important for students to develop their confidence in using accounting software as those skills are transferrable to other reporting systems they will encounter as graduates."

For Schonfeldt, MYOB met and exceeded these requirements. "My experience using MYOB to administer the assignment has been very positive. The support provided by MYOB's education team has been exceptional as they've partnered with us to enhance the student experience."

Real-world accounting education

Practical experience is one of the most valuable assets a graduating student can have. That's why MYOB has been partnering with institutions like the University of Canterbury (UC) and Swinburne University of Technology (VET) to give students hands-on experience of our widely-used software.

There is great interest from the students themselves to learn cloud software. "We saw a clear need to add more practical, online components to the course, " said Inna Kazakevich, Teacher of Accounting and Bookkeeping at Swinburne.

The decision to use MYOB was an easy one. Julia Wu, Senior Lecturer in Accounting at UC, said it allowed her to create a flexible, student-led learning experience.

Wu said. "We don't 'teach' it in the traditional sense. Learning and assessment activities guide students through various tasks that mimic a real-world business operation."

MYOB Digital Challenge fosters innovation

Innovation is at the core of the MYOB Digital Challenge. But it's also an opportunity for university students to hone and demonstrate the in-demand traits of our industry – disruptive thinking, collaboration and team work.

Originally appearing at the University of Auckland in 2015 in partnership with the University of Auckland Case Club, now the MYOB Digital Challenge is online, and international, with university students across Australia and New Zealand invited to compete.

Each team has a week to produce a video about their proposed tech based solution, along with a one-page executive summary to solve a real business problem. The results will be judged by a panel of MYOB employees. From there, the finalists go on to receive tailored mentoring and to further refine their ideas and develop a working prototype ahead of the MYOB Digital Challenge Trans-Tasman Final. Finalists will be competing for a cash prize pool of \$8,500.

"What makes this competition so unique is that it encourages the kind of entrepreneurial mindset that will have a key role in shaping how Australians and New Zealanders do business in the future," said Kristina Nutt, MYOB Emerging Talent Lead.

Douglas Shephard has first-hand knowledge of the opportunities the Challenge presents to graduates.

"I presented an AI-based solution with two teammates at my first Digital Challenge in 2017," said Shephard. "In 2018, I was pitching a new application for MYOB only to see one of my 2017 teammate at the judging table as a MYOB employee." Mika Siddiqui competed in the MYOB Digital Challenge every year he was studying. "Each year, our teamwork skills become stronger. Another skill I feel has developed in a big way is my public speaking. I'm able to convey ideas more comfortably, which has resulted in me being a more confident person."
